## A NOTE FROM PRINCIPAL LAURA WANSTREET

Welcome and welcome back! Summer break is always a great time for me to relax and be with my family and the time off rejuvenates all of us. I hope you had time to enjoy your children and thank you for sending them back to us!

My name is Laura Wanstreet and I am the Principal of Horizon Honors Elementary. The Elementary School is made up of our Primary School (PS) - Pre-K through 4th Grade and our Intermediate School (IS) – 5th and 6th Grades. I have been with HCLC for over 11 years. I taught for several years in district, private and other charter schools before coming to HCLC in 1998. Some of you may recall I taught K-1 (Kindergarten and 1st Grade multi-age combination) and 4-5 (4th and 5th Grade multi-age combination). I was a Team Leader, Mentor Teacher and Master Teacher prior to becoming the Elementary Principal in 2007. I look forward to meeting our new families and welcoming back returning families.

## ILP - INDIVIDUAL LEARNING PLAN

### What is an ILP?

An Individual Learning Plan (ILP). It is a plan designed for each student each quarter and includes a list of learning outcomes the student is expected to achieve by the end of the quarter. This list will serve as both a visual indicator of progress and an agenda for personal conferences with the student's teachers and parents. Progress on the learning outcomes will be noted on the PowerSchool program. The final level of achievement on each learning outcome will be a part of the student's ILP. ILPs are developed each quarter during a student/parent/teacher conference. The conference includes a review of the student's progress and goals for the upcoming quarter. Participation in the ILP conference is required. Students might not be promoted to the next grade level without this involvement.

### How can you prepare for your child's ILP conference?

Make note of your child's academic and social strengths and areas they struggle. What do you see when you are working with them at home? This will be important information as you work with the teachers to develop the ILP.

First quarter ILPs are scheduled for August 12th and August 13th. Call (480) 659-3100 to schedule your conference. Students are not in school on ILP days, but should come with their parents to their scheduled ILP conference.

## DROP OFF & PICK UP

Your support is needed to keep our community safe...

Please use the traffic flow maps [found on our HCLC Web site](#) when picking up or dropping off your child. You may also choose to find a parking space and walk in. These are the only two safe and legal options.

### Reminders:

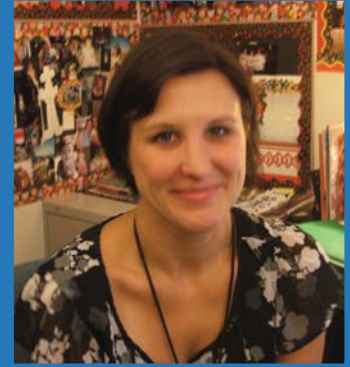
- Pull forward to allow for other cars to drop-off & pick-up – if there is space ahead of you, please fill it
- Drop-off & pick-up at the curb - Do not drop-off or pick-up from the far lanes
- Refrain from using your cell phone in the pick-up line – maximum attention is required for everyone's safety
- Have your child's name and their classroom clearly marked in your car window
- Attend to the staff members managing traffic in the lot
- If you have a child dismissing at 3:15 p.m., please pull around or park if you arrive prior to 3:15 p.m. If you are waiting at the curb it is holding up the traffic line.

Please also note that stopping and/or parking on Frye Road is illegal. It also creates a frighteningly unsafe situation for our students and their families. As cars stop along Frye, a back up of traffic is created. Some people choose to pass on the left and this is another unsafe and illegal practice. The Phoenix Police have issued tickets for both of these violations. The area is marked and "No Stopping" signs are posted.

Thank you for your support and diligence in this matter. Each one of us has a responsibility in keeping our community safe.

## MEET STUDENT ADVISOR MS. K!

Welcome to another exciting year filled with amazing learning opportunities! My name is Kelly Kowalczyk, otherwise known as "Ms. K.," and I am the Primary and Intermediate School Student Advisor. I am here to provide extra support and resources for our students. ## FITNESS FOR LIFE & WELLNESS WEEK

HCLC is participating in a national health program called Fitness for Life: Elementary School. Beginning in August, we will conduct a Wellness Week four times a year, once every quarter. During each Wellness Week, the entire school will be participating in physical activity and nutrition programs designed to promote lifelong health and fitness. Components of Wellness Week include classroom activity breaks using specially prepared videos that enhance our students' fitness, nutrition programs in the classroom, special school wide events and celebration activities.

Our first Wellness week is scheduled for August 16th. The themes for our first Wellness week are:  
Physical Activity Theme - daily moderate physical activity  
Nutrition theme - eat fruits and vegetables

During Wellness Week we will include activities each day including "Eat Well Wednesday" and a K-6 team activity on Friday. You will receive more information from your child's P.E. teacher as the week approaches!

**What is a Master Teacher and who are they?**

A Master Teacher is a teacher of teachers. They lead professional development for the different grade levels and teams, providing demonstration lessons, coaching, and team-teaching to classroom teachers. The role also includes working with the principal to create and institute an academic achievement plan. They also partner with the principal in sharing the responsibility of interacting with students and parents.

**Who are the Master Teachers at Horizon Honors Primary School?**

Tamra Shaw (top photo) is the Master Teacher for Kindergarten through Second Grade and special area teachers. Mrs. Shaw has taught at HCLC for four years and was the Kindergarten Mentor Teacher for the last three years. Christi Burdette (bottom photo) is the Master Teacher for Third through Sixth Grade teachers, in addition to the special area teachers. Mrs. Burdette has been part of the HCLC team for 13 years, and for the last six as a Master Teacher.
